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Overview

KEY FACTS TO KNOW

- **All duty free retail across all three terminals** is run by a single operator, Dubai Duty Free — unlike most major hub airports, which split concessions among several retailers.
- **Dubai Duty Free is one of the largest single-site travel retailers** in the world.
- Best known for oversized liquor, tobacco and perfume halls, a heavy emphasis on gold and fine jewellery, and its long-running "**Finest Surprise**" raffles.

SPECIAL OFFERINGS

- **Finest Surprise raffles** — a single ticket can win a Bentley, a Range Rover, or a bar of gold. Sold at dedicated counters in every terminal.
- **Millennium Millionaire** — a AED 1,000 (US \$278) ticket gives a 1-in-5,000 chance to win US \$1,000,000 in cash.

T1 Terminal 1

International Airlines — Concourse D, connected by a short train ride

KEY FEATURES

- **Used by roughly 150 international carriers** outside the Emirates & flydubai networks.
- Concourse D serves these carriers with a **modern, open-plan retail setup** — reads less as a boutique gallery than a vast, single-operator department store built for volume rather than flagship theatre.

NOTABLE SHOPS

- **Le Clos (Express Location)** — a boutique setup offering high-end spirits, rare whiskies, and fine wines.
- Extensive **perfume & cosmetics** runs anchored by Chanel, Dior and Estée Lauder counters, plus beauty

& clean-beauty kiosks with custom "scent walls," personalized fragrance blending, and luxury skincare sets.

- **High-End Watch Boutiques** — Rolex, Montblanc, Tiffany & Co., and Cartier.
- Dedicated **gold & jewellery** sections, plus electronics and confectionery halls.

INTERESTING THINGS TO BUY

- **Duty-Free Gold Bars & Coins** — small-investment gold bullion and 24k coins, purchased directly at Dubai Duty Free counters.
- **Travel-Exclusive Cosmetics Kits** — bundled skincare and fragrance sets from Jo Malone, Tom Ford, and Dior not available in standard retail shops.
- **Traditional Saffron & Persian Sweets** — high-grade saffron threads, baklava gift boxes, and authentic Turkish delight.

T2 Terminal 2

flydubai and regional / CIS-focused carriers

KEY FEATURES

- **The airport's smallest and most utilitarian** terminal.
- Shopping here is built for **quick purchases**, not lingering luxury browsing.

NOTABLE SHOPS

- **Dubai Duty Free Express** — one streamlined marketplace covering cosmetics, electronics, tobacco and confectionery.

SPECIAL OFFERINGS

- Finest Surprise ticket counter — AED 500 (US \$139) to win a luxury supercar.

INTERESTING THINGS TO BUY

- **Local Souvenirs & Gifts** — mini Burj models, Arabic coffee (Dallah) sets, and brass lanterns.
- **Bulk Confectionery** — multi-packs of Toblerone, Lindt, and Ferrero, plus local pistachios and nuts in discounted duty-free bundles.
- **Travel Tech & Electronics** — power banks, noise-canceling headphones, and global adapters at competitive tax-free rates.

T3 Terminal 3 — Emirates Hub

Concourses A, B & C, linked by internal train

KEY FEATURES

- **The flagship terminal**, providing the ultimate luxury travel retail experience across all three concourses.
- Carries Dubai Duty Free's flagship retail push alongside a growing roster of standalone luxury boutiques.
- Concourse C is partly used by flydubai.

NOTABLE SHOPS

- **Le Clos** — a world-class wine and spirits boutique stocking ultra-rare vintages, collectible single malts, and flight-exclusive wines, with complimentary bottle engraving and gate delivery.
- **The Gold Souk Area** (Dubai Duty Free, Concourse B) — 18k, 22k, and 24k gold jewelry sold tax-free by weight.
- **Emirates Official Store** — aviation memorabilia, aircraft models (including limited-edition fleet replicas), travel gear, and branded apparel.
- **Luxury Fashion Avenues** — multi-story flagship boutiques from Louis Vuitton, Hermès, Chanel, Gucci, and Dior.
- **Concourse A** — newest openings, including Cartier and a Chanel store near Gate A24.
- **Concourse B** — luxury mixed with electronics and travel accessories; a second Cartier near Gate B18, Chanel near Gate B16.
- **Concourse C** — dominated by Dubai Duty Free's own multi-category stores: perfume, cosmetics, books, chocolate and electronics.

INTERESTING THINGS TO BUY

- **Airport & Travel Exclusive Spirits** — rare single-cask whiskies and limited-run spirits created specifically for Dubai Duty Free.
- **Bateel Dates** — gourmet, organic stuffed dates filled with caramelized nuts, orange peel, or chocolate.
- **Middle Eastern Perfumes & Oud** — high-end regional scents and niche fragrance houses, with complimentary bottle engraving stations.
- **Camel Milk Chocolates** — unique local treats from Al Nassma, available in various spices and cocoa percentages.

Arriving & Clearing Customs

Applies airport-wide, on entry into Dubai

RESTRICTIONS & LIMITS

- Up to **4 litres** of spirits/wine, or **288 cans** of beer.
- Up to **400 cigarettes**, **50 cigars**, or **500 g** of tobacco.

- Gifts & personal items: combined value up to **AED 3,000 (US \$815)**.
