KEY FACTS TO KNOW

- One of Latin America's true duty free hubs, built around **Copa Airlines'** role as "the Hub of the Americas."
- Roughly **70% of passengers** are in transit rather than starting or ending their trip at Tocumen.
- Duty free is split between **Duty Free Americas (DFA)** and Panama's own **Motta Internacional**, which operates under the **Attenza Duty Free** brand.

T1 Terminal 1

Tocumen's original terminal, along the main concourse and North Pier

KEY FEATURES

- Duty Free Americas holds **two of the three duty free concessions**, with Motta Internacional/Attenza running the third.
- Stores are spread along the **main departures concourse and the North Pier**, serving heavy connecting traffic through Copa's hub-and-spoke network.

NOTABLE SHOPS

- Fragrance, cosmetics, liquor, tobacco, watches, electronics and confectionery.

INTERESTING THINGS TO BUY

- Electronics, appliances and spirits** are particular strengths here, given the transit-heavy passenger mix.

T2 Terminal 2

Opened 2019 — home to Attenza Duty Free's flagship store

KEY FEATURES

- Opened in **2019**; houses Attenza Duty Free's showcase store, **over 1,000 sq m**, with a sensory design concept that makes it the airport's strongest showcase for prestige beauty and spirits.
- Duty Free Americas also holds space here.

NOTABLE SHOPS

- More than **200 brands**, spanning Carolina Herrera, Dior and Lancôme to Johnnie Walker, Concha y Toro and Swatch.
- Regional exclusives from **Jo Malone, Tom Ford, Bond No. 9 and Acqua di Parma**.
- A dedicated **Dior Beauty boutique**.

Other Things to Know

RESTRICTIONS & LIMITS

- Due to local trade rules, PTY duty-free shops carry products not easily found in US airports, such as **Havana Club Cuban rum and genuine Cuban cigars** — check your home country's import limits before buying.
- Since most travelers are connecting between flights across the Americas, liquids (rum, perfume) over **100ml** should be sealed in a **Security Tamper-Evident Bag (STEB)** with the receipt inside so they clear subsequent transit security checkpoints safely.

TRAVELER TIPS

- Panama produces world-class **rum**, and PTY is the best place to find top-shelf expressions.
- Prices on cosmetics, international designer items and basic souvenirs can carry **high markups** compared to Panama City or standard US/EU retail — stick to regional rums, coffee and travel-exclusive promotions for true savings.
