KEY FACTS TO KNOW

- **Dufry (Avolta)** controls close to **50,000 sq ft** of concession space split between Terminal 1 and Terminal 3 — Pearson has no Terminal 2.
- Toronto's duty free splits by **airline alliance** rather than by domestic/international routing.
- Signature specialty category is **Canadiana** — maple syrup, icewine and "Tastefully Canadian" souvenir lines appear throughout both terminals.

T1 Terminal 1

Air Canada's home base — hub for all Star Alliance carriers

- Air Canada's home base and hub for all **Star Alliance** carriers.

NOTABLE SHOPS

- **Toronto Duty Free** sits near Gate F60/F61 just past the US-bound checkpoint, stocked with brand-name perfumes, cosmetics and a dedicated liquor selection.
- A second Dufry store near **Gate E76** on the international side carries **Coach, Burberry, Michael Kors, Longchamp and Gucci** alongside fragrances and Tastefully Canadian gift items.

T3 Terminal 3

NOTABLE SHOPS

- Its newest store, opened in **2025** near Gate C36, is built around a "Made in Canada" concept showcasing domestic wine, spirits and confections.
- Further Dufry outposts near **Gates A10, B22 and B41** cover the US and international departure flows with the standard luxury cosmetics-and-accessories mix.

Other Things to Know

TRAVELER TIPS

- Best place to buy **Canadian icewine** tax free — it's heavily taxed at normal retail stores.
- A great source for travel-exclusive **Canadian whiskies** not sold in government liquor stores.
- Passengers flying to the US clear **US Customs at Pearson (Preclearance)**; duty-free shops at the US Transborder departure gates (T1 Gate F61, T3 Gate A) sell liquor and cosmetics right before boarding.
- Liquids over 100ml bought airside (spirits, wine, maple syrup) should be sealed by the cashier in a **Secure Tamper-Evident Bag (STEB)** with the receipt visible, so they can be carried through security on a connecting flight.
